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Registration Aims

APM Registered Project Professional (RPP) is a competence standard in Project Management. Successful candidates are included on the publicly available APM Register of Project Professionals.

Registration Target Group

This professional registration is designed for Project Professionals who want to be able to demonstrate the capabilities of a responsible leader, have the ability to manage a complex project and use appropriate tools, processes and techniques.

Accreditation body

The accreditation body is the Association for Project Management.

Registration Benefits

The wider public can be confident that successful RPPs have been externally assessed as competent and dedicated to their own continuing development.

For employers, this visible investment in staff offers the benefit of raising the profile of project management as a driver for competitive advantage and improved project delivery. For the individual they can be proud of satisfying one of the most stringent project management assessments in the world.

There is a growing recognition of the value that competent and capable project professionals can offer to society – both public and private sector. RPP sets project professionals apart through a robust assessment of project professionalism. Successful candidates will be entered onto the APM Register of Project Professionals. The register demonstrates to users of project management services and the wider public those professionals who have met the standard for RPP.

The Registration Process

The assessment for APM Registered Project Professional has two parts:

- A portfolio of evidence: To demonstrate competence across 29 core and 18 complementary project management competences, which is to be accompanied by your CPD log.
- A professional review: An interview with two peer APM Registered Project Professional assessors.

Successful candidates need to be able to provide evidence of:

- Managing others in a complex project environment.
- Demonstrating responsible leadership.
- Exhibiting professional and ethical behaviour.
- Demonstrating competence in 29 core project management competences.
- 35 hours of Continuing Professional Development (CPD) within the last 12 months, in accordance with the APM CPD scheme.

Qualification Gained

APM Registered Project Professional (RPP)

Course Aims

Those already working as a Project Manager or in a project team role and wish to develop their project management expertise to professional level.

Duration	2 days' preparatory training 3 days' assessment
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Course Target Group

This course is suitable for delegates who have passed both the Gen2 APM introductory course and the APMP Project Management Course. Alternatively, this course is suitable for delegates who have at least 3 years' experience in a project management role or who have been part of a team on a complex project for this duration.
